

C-5 Preparing Child Restraint to Fit Your Child

You MUST make these adjustments with your child before you install the child restraint in the vehicle.



1. To Remove Carrier from Base

From the back of the carrier, pull the base release handle out and lift the carrier out of the base.



2. Loosen Harness

Push down on the harness release lever (under flap on the front of restraint) while pulling out on the harness as shown.



3. Release Chest Clip

Press on chest clip release button and pull apart.

4. Unbuckle Harness

Press red button.

Pull buckle tongues out.

Place harness straps out of the way.



5. Place Child in Child Restraint

Place the child's bottom and back flat against the restraint.

This will allow the harness straps to be properly tightened.



6. Check Buckle Position

Determine which of the available buckle positions will provide a snug fit for your child.



7. To Change Buckle Position

Remove child.

From under the seat, rotate the metal retainer then insert retainer up through the carrier and pad.



a. For small infants, skip to step c.

Insert the buckle's metal retainer through the desired slot.

Make sure that the buckle is **facing out.**



b. Pull up on buckle strap to make sure it is secured.



Push each buckle tongue into buckle until you hear a "click."

3. Close Chest Clip

Insert right half of chest clip into left half and snap together.



6. Position Chest Clip

The chest clip must be placed at mid-chest (even with armpits) and away from the child's neck.



4. Tighten Harness

Pull on harness adjustment strap to tighten harness snugly.

NOTE: A snug strap should not allow any slack. It lies in a relatively straight line without sagging. It does not press on the child's flesh or push the child's body into an unnatural position.



Failure to fasten and tighten the harness system correctly and snugly can result in serious injury or death.



5. Check Harness Tightness

Try to pinch the harness at the shoulders vertically between index finger and thumb.

If you can pinch the harness strap, tighten more.

If your fingers slip off, the harness is tight enough.

C-7 Removing Child From Child Restraint



1. Loosen Harness

Push down on the harness release lever (under flap on the front of restraint) while pulling out on the harness as shown.



2. Release Chest Clip

Press on chest clip release button and pull apart.



3. Unbuckle Harness

Press red button.
Pull buckle tongues out.
Place harness straps out of the way.
Remove child.

C-8 Reclining the Base

The base has multiple recline positions. Use any of these to help you achieve the recline angle needed for the weight of your child.



Push in on the base adjustment button and either lift or lower front of base.

C-9 Removing Harness System



1. Remove Harness Straps from Splitter Plate

Fully loosen harness straps. Locate splitter plate on the back of the child restraint and unfasten the harness straps.



2. Remove Harness Straps

- (1) Pull harness through the upper harness slots from the front.
- (2) Unthread harness from the chest clip.
- (3) Do not unbuckle the buckle. Unthread

harness from the buckle tongues.

C-12 Accessories



Harness Covers

Harness covers help provide comfort to the neck.

If harness covers will not allow proper positioning of the chest clip or interfere with getting a tight enough fit for a smaller baby, remove and do not use.

Store until child is large enough to use these harness covers while maintaining a properly fitting harness.

To remove harness covers, pull the fastening strips apart and remove harness covers.

Head Pillow

Loosen the harness straps.

To remove head pillow, pull it up from behind the body pillow.


You must use the body pillow in order to use the head pillow.

Body Pillow

To remove body pillow, pull buckle through the slot in bottom pillow and slide the pillow out from behind the harness straps.

D-1 Understanding Your Vehicle

Your vehicle's features may be considerably different than those pictured here. Consult your vehicle owner's manual to help identify your vehicle's specific features and locations.



Vehicle Seat Belts

Consult your vehicle owner's manual for vehicle belt use.



LATCH Anchors

Located in the seat bight.



Air Bags

Consult your vehicle owner's manual for all airbag locations.

Safety Tip:

To avoid your child being seriously burned, take the following precautions:

- 1. Park in the shade or where sun does not directly hit the child restraint.
- 2. Cover the child restraint with a sheet or blanket when not in use.
- 3. Check for hot child restraint and buckles before placing child in child restraint.

To help protect your vehicle seat's upholstery from damage, use a single layered towel underneath and behind child restraint.

D-2 Vehicle Seating Position

Some seating positions in your vehicle may not be safe for this child restraint. Some vehicles do not have a seating position that can be used safely with this child restraint. If you are not sure where to place the child restraint in your vehicle, consult your vehicle owner's manual or contact Dorel Juvenile Group Consumer Relations Department.

A WARNING:



Never place a child rear facing in a seating position with an active frontal airbag. This can result in serious injury or death.





Use the child restraint only on vehicle seats that face forward. Do not use on seats that face the sides or rear of the vehicle.

Safety Tip:



Children are safer when properly restrained in rear seating positions than in the front seating positions.

According to National Highway Traffic Safety Administration information, children in rear seating positions are statistically safer, whether you have airbags, advanced airbags, or no airbags at all.

D-3 Choosing LATCH or Vehicle Belts





The LATCH System

LATCH (Lower Anchors and Tethers for CHildren) is a universal system for installing child restraints without using vehicle seat belts.

The LATCH system can ONLY be used in vehicles that have the LATCH anchor bars installed and designated LATCH seating positions. Most vehicles manufactured after September 2002 are equipped with LATCH.

Check your vehicle owner's manual to see which seating positions may be equipped with the LATCH system.



Vehicle Belts

If LATCH is not an option, you must use the vehicle seat belt system to install the child restraint. There are some vehicle belts that will not work with a child restraint or will require special

attention. See next page and check your vehicle owner's manual for specific instructions.

A WARNING:

Do not use both the LATCH belt and vehicle belt at the same time.

D-4 Knowing Your Vehicle Belts

Review your vehicle owner's manual for vehicle seat belt use with child restraints. This is your best source for information concerning your vehicle.

Not all vehicle belts will work with this child restraint. This child restraint must be tightly locked in place at all times, during travel. You must determine if your vehicles belts are compatible with this child restraint.

Vehicle Belts

Automatic/Passive vehicle seat belts

You MUST have a vehicle lap belt to install any child restraint. An automatic (passive) shoulder vehicle belt may or may not have a separate vehicle lap belt. Consult your vehicle owner's manual.



 Vehicle belts in center of the door or side panel

You must move the child restraint to another seating location. Consult your vehicle owner's manual.



Vehicle belts that are in front of the seat bight

You may need to move the child restraint to another seating location. Consult your vehicle owner's manual.

Do Not Use with inflatable seat belts

You may need to move the child restraint to another seating location or use LATCH belts only.

• ELR (Emergency Locking Retractor) vehicle belts

These lap and shoulder vehicle belts only lock in a sudden stop or crash, and do not properly secure a child restraint alone. Consult your vehicle owner's manual.



To determine if you have this type of vehicle belt, gently pull the vehicle belt all the way out of the retractor (spool), let it return several inches, then pull on it again.

If it moves freely, it is an ELR vehicle belt.

If it is locked and will not allow any more vehicle belt to come out, it is a switchable retractor.

A WARNING:

ELR lap-only vehicle belts MUST NOT be used with this child restraint.

Switchable retractor

These vehicle belts switch from ELR to ALR (Automatic Locking Retractor). You must have the vehicle belts in the locking mode to use them. Follow the instructions in the installation sections.

ALR (Automatic Locking Retractor)

These vehicle belts lock after pulling the webbing out and letting the vehicle belt go back into the retractor an inch or two. Follow the instructions in the installation sections.

Vehicle Latch Plates

Check the Latch Plates



Grasp the tongue portion of the latch plate (the part that goes inside the buckle) and pull straight out, in line with the vehicle lap belt. If the latch plate does not slide up and down the vehicle belt, you have a locking latch plate. You should not need to use a locking clip. Consult your

vehicle owner's manual.

If the latch plate slides up and down on the vehicle belt, and you have an ELR retractor, you **MUST** use a locking clip to install the child restraint. You may not need to use the locking clip with a switchable or ALR retractor. Consult your vehicle owner's manual.

D-5 Aircraft Information



This restraint is certified for aircraft use.

Use only on forward-facing aircraft seats. Follow instructions for vehicle installation.



Failure to follow these warnings can result in serious injury or death.



1. Place Base in Vehicle Rear Facing

Center the base between the vehicle anchors in the chosen seating position.



2. Remove LATCH from Storage



3. Thread LATCH Belt
Thread LATCH hooks
through belt path openings.



4. Attach LATCH Hooks to Vehicle LATCH Anchors



5. Tighten Belt

Push base down FIRMLY on the base and towards the vehicle seat while pulling up on the belt to tighten.



6. Tuck Loose End of Belt

You MUST tuck loose end of the LATCH belt back through the belt path hole.



7. Check Belt Tightness

Grasp the base <u>at the belt path with one hand.</u>
Push and pull the child restraint from side to side, forward and back.

NOTE: If it moves more than 1 in. (2.5 cm), try reinstalling the child restraint or try another seating location.



8. Attach Carrier to Base

Secure child in child restraint.



Carry handle MUST be upright AND locked when installed in the vehicle.

AWARNING:

9. Check Angle Indicator

Check the angle indicator while parked on level ground. The ball should be in the zone that matches the weight of your child.

Repeat steps 3-8 if not reclined correctly and adjust base if needed (see section C-8).

You may need to place a large rolled towel or foam pool noodles under the front of the base to achieve correct recline angle.

Check often to be sure padding is still in place and the belt is tight.







To Remove LATCH Belt From Vehicle Anchor

Remove shell from base.

Remove tension from the lower anchor belt by pushing down on side of base with the lower anchor belt adjuster. Then press the adjuster button to loosen belt

Unhook from anchor by squeezing spring lever on hook, pushing hook back into the seat bight, and twisting. Then pull it out of the vehicle seat.

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E-3 Installing Base with Vehicle Belts

NOTE: Review section D-4 and your vehicle owner's manual for vehicle belt use.

A WARNING:

Do not use LATCH along with the vehicle lap or lap/shoulder belt. Store LATCH when using the vehicle belts.

Check the vehicle belt before each use. Use only if the belt is tightened properly and securely.

Failure to follow these warnings can result in serious injury or death.



1. Store LATCH



2. Place Base in Vehicle Rear Facing

Center the base in the chosen seating position.

3. Thread Vehicle Belt

Thread the vehicle lap or lap/shoulder belt combination through belt path as shown.

With an ALR belt, pull the belt all the way out before threading the base.



4. Tighten Belt

Push base down FIRMLY on the base and towards the vehicle seat while pulling up on the belt to tighten.



5. Check Belt Tightness

Grasp the base <u>at the belt path with one hand.</u>

Repeat steps 3-6 if not reclined correctly and adjust base if needed (see section C-8).



You may need to place a large rolled towel or foam pool noodles under the front of the base to achieve correct recline angle.

Check often to be sure padding is still in place and the belt is tight.







A WARNING:



Never place a child rear facing in a seating position with an active frontal airbag. This can result in serious injury or death.

This child restraint must always face the rear of the vehicle.

Do not use LATCH along with the vehicle lap or lap/shoulder belt. Store LATCH when using the vehicle belts.



E-5 Installing Child Restraint with Vehicle Belts

NOTE: Review section D-4 and your vehicle owner's manual for vehicle belt use.



1. Place Child Restraint in Vehicle Rear Facing

Secure child in child restraint.

Center the child restraint in the chosen seating position.

Check the angle indicator while parked on level ground. The ball should be in the zone that matches the weight of your child.



2. Thread Vehicle Belt

Thread vehicle lap belt through the belt path (as shown).

Buckle the vehicle belt.

With an ALR belt, pull the belt all the way out before threading.



3. Tighten Vehicle Belt

Lay your forearm across child restraint at the belt path while pulling up on belt to tighten.

Feed the slack back into the retractor while tightening.

4. Check Belt Tightness

Grasp the child restraint at the belt path with one **hand.** Push and pull the child restraint from side to side, forward and back. The child restraint should not move more than 1 in. (2.5 cm).

NOTE: If it moves more than 1 in. (2.5 cm), try reinstalling the child restraint or try another seating location.



5. Reheck Angle Indicator

Check the angle indicator while parked on level ground. The ball should be in the zone that matches the weight of your child.

Repeat steps 1-4 if not reclined correctly.

Using a Locking Clip


You will rarely need to use a locking clip except for in some older vehicles. Built in child restraint locking systems have been required in vehicles since 1996, and many vehicles had these features even earlier.

Check your vehicle owner's manual to learn how to use the systems in your vehicle. If you need a locking clip, please go back to the store where you purchased this child restraint and purchase one or call us at 1-800-544-1108 to order one. Locking clips from any child restraint manufacturer are okay to use.

Remove the locking clip when the vehicle seat belt is not being used with the child restraint. A locking clip will not fix all types of seat belt problems.

Refer to section D-4 and your vehicle's owner manual to determine if your vehicle belts require a locking clip.

Directions below describe installing the child restraint without the base. Same steps apply for use on the base. See section E-3 or E-5 for vehicle belt step by step installation.



1. Place Child Restraint in Vehicle Rear Facing

Secure child in child restraint.

Center the child restraint in the chosen seating position.

Check the angle indicator while parked on level ground. The ball should be in the zone that matches the weight of your child.



2. Thread Vehicle Belt

Thread vehicle lap belt through the belt path (as shown).

Buckle the vehicle belt.



3. Tighten Vehicle Belt

Lay your forearm across child restraint at the belt path while pulling up on belt to tighten.



4. Locate Locking Clip Location


Grasp both vehicle belts together just behind the latch plate and unbuckle. NOTE: If the latch plate ends up just at the belt path opening so you

cannot grasp the vehicle belt at the latch plate, grasp the vehicle belts on the opposite side of the child restraint, as close to the latch plate as possible.



5. Attach Locking Clip

Thread both portions of the vehicle belt onto the locking clip, as close to the latch plate as possible.



6. Position Locking Clip

Position locking clip about 1 in. (2.5 cm) from vehicle belt's latch plate.


Rebuckle vehicle belt.



7. Check Belt Tightness

Grasp the child restraint at the belt path with one hand. Push and pull the child restraint from side to side, forward and back. The child restraint should not move more than 1 in.



Troubleshooting

- 1. If the child restraint buckle or harness release lever sticks or you cannot get the straps tight enough around child: DO NOT LUBRICATE. Check around lever and retractor for dropped food, sticky spilled drinks, dirt, leaves, etc. Clean with warm water and/or remove object with tweezers. If you cannot get the harness to adjust and remain tight with the buckle securely locked, do not use the child restraint.
- 2. **If your harness twists:** Straighten the harness each time you put your child in the child restraint to help prevent twisting. Lock the buckle and tighten harness and it will be ready for next use.
